Competition announcement

The next Carlene Neihart International Pipe Organ Competition will be held on April 10, 2010 in Kansas City, Missouri at the Second Presbyterian Church. The 1949 Moller Pipe Organ has been rebuilt and restored in 2009 and includes a new movable console. .Contestants from various places in the United States and in other countries are expected to enter the competition.

Quimby Pipe Organs , Inc, will underwrite the 1st place award (\$2500) and the second place award (\$1500) is sponsored **by Casavant Freres and Caroll Hanson.** The third place award is \$1000. The Carlene Neihart Organ Competition Foundation , with a 501 (C)(3) tax-exempt status was formed to organize, present the competition and fund the prize money to help sustain the future of the Pipe Organ.
